

The RECYCLING Barrel

Commingled Cans & Bottles



Empty • Rinse • Keep items loose (do not bag)



Plastic Jugs



Plastic Dairy
Tubs/Lids



Plastic Bottles
& Jars



Cartons
(e.g., soup, juice, milk,
broth, wine, beans)



Glass Bottles & Jars



Metal Cans, Aluminum Foil,
Small Metal Food Trays,
Metal Lids (over 2")

NO

- Foam from egg crates, trays, or packaging
- Plastic from bakery, produce, deli, food trays, cups, or utensils
- Cushioning/insulation from produce or grocery delivery boxes



Clean, Dry, & Stacked

Wind & rain are problems for recyclables. You can help by putting items out early on collection morning or by taking them to the center. **Never** use the recycling barrel for paper & cardboard.

Paper & Cardboard

Tie or neatly stack cardboard • Place next to barrel
Put paper in Village crate, paper bag, or cardboard box

Paper & Cardboard

- Cardboard boxes & paper bags
- Mail, envelopes, office & writing paper
- Newsprint
- Magazines & catalogs



Remember:

Papers can be mixed with cardboard at the curbside, but must still be separated from cardboard at the recycling center.

NO

- Plastic bags
- Foam (see pg 6)
- Hardcover books (see pg 4)



On Curbside Bulk Days

Keep these items separate from bulk trash

Recycle Appliances, Automobile Batteries, Metal Objects & Tires



Remember:

- Remove refrigerator doors
- No large truck or heavy machinery tires
- Poles and pipes should not be longer than 4 feet
- Deliver gas-powered lawn equipment to the recycling center (drain oils and fluids first)



Vegetative Yard Waste Pickup

Accepted at the recycling center • Curbside pickup available from **April 4-October 9** • Place items in a barrel or brown paper lawn/leaf bag

RULES: Place grass clippings and brush in a barrel (no larger than 32 gallons or heavier than 80 pounds), or in a paper biodegradable lawn/leaf bag. Branches (up to 3 feet in length and 2 inches in diameter-no logs) should be bundled and tied. Yard waste that includes dirt, rocks, wood chips and large root balls will not be collected. All items must be placed at the curb. No plastic bags or Village recycling barrels will be picked up.



What about leaves? Beginning on October 13, and in accordance with your designated area, please place loose leaves in the street at the curb line, and bagged leaves on the curb. You will receive a Leaf Flyer mailed to your home prior to the start of Leaf Season with instructions. Branches, twigs, brush, grass, pumpkins, hay bales, corn stalks or any other Yard Waste will not be collected during Leaf Season. Only leaves will be collected during Leaf Season. Please call 201-670-5585 with any questions regarding Yard Waste or Leaf Season.

| Books for donation | Recycling center In good condition with an ISBN barcode on the cover. (No water-damaged books, encyclopedias, or magazines) |
| Clothing/textiles | Recycling center |
| Concrete | Recycling center Limit: One 32 gallon barrel of material. (No contractors, no asphalt, no colored concrete, no red brick, no ceramics) |
| E-Waste (TVs, PCs, etc) | Recycling center |
| Foam packaging | Recycling center (see pg 6) |
| Hardcover books (that cannot be donated) | Remove & discard covers. Package interior pages with papers for recycling. |
| Household batteries | Throw alkaline batteries away. Give button cell and dry-cell rechargeable batteries weighing up to 11 lbs. (and 300 Wh for Li-ion) to the recycling center attendant. Tape the terminal ends with non-conductive tape. |
| Inkjet & laser cartridges | Recycling center attendant |
| Mattresses | Recycling center (Must be bagged) |
| Vegetable oil | Recycling center (Only canola, corn, cottonseed, grapeseed, olive, palm, peanut, safflower, sesame, soybean, sunflower & vegetable) |
