Goose egg addling is a wildlife management technique that involves treating eggs to prevent them from hatching. The goal is to reduce the number of geese in areas where they cause damage or are a threat to public health and safety.

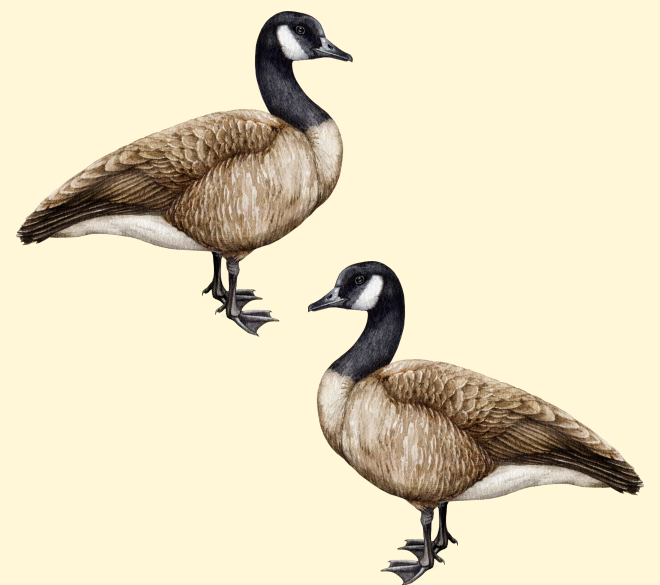
