MYSTERY MEMBER

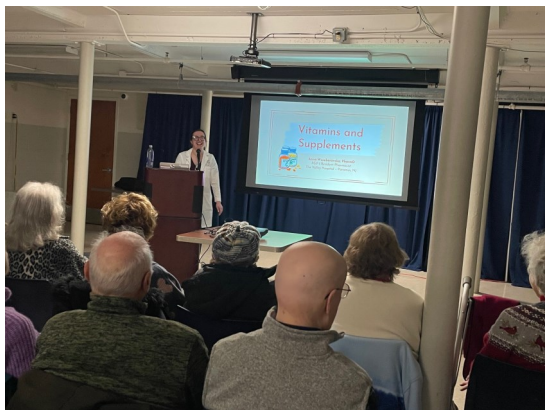

IMPORTANT HISTORICAL RIDGEWOOD RESIDENTS

Margaret Roukema



**Born Margaret Ellen Scafati on September 19, 1929 in
Newark, New Jersey. She was raised in East Orange.
She graduated from Montclair College in 1951. Marge
was an American history teacher in Ridgewood High
School. She also served on the Board of Education in
Ridgewood from 1970 – 1973.**

**Marge married psychiatrist Richard Roukema and had
three children.**

**She ran for the United State House of Representative in 1978 and lost to
Andrew Maguire. She ran against Maguire again in 1980 and won.
She was re-elected 11 times in the 7th and 5th congressional districts,
respectfully. She left office in 2003 as the longest-tenured
female member of Congress.**
